<b>OBJECTIVE:</b>	Board Approval

### lssue

Medford Water reconsiders its Cost of Service on an annual basis in order to equitably allocate revenue requirements to the various customer classes of service.

### Discussion

Shawn Koorn and Kevin Lorentzen of HDR, Inc. presented study sessions to the Board on November 6 and November 20 on the 2024 Cost of Service Study.

There are no proposed changes to the rate structure or customer classes of service for all schedules, class usage characteristics and cost information was updated, and specific rate components will be assessed based on actual costs: high level surcharges (system average adjustment), backflow fee (no change), and the Bulk Water Rate (updated based on current costs of providing services).

Based on HDR's analysis, staff recommends board consideration of modifications in the monthly and gallonage charges for all customer groups. A non-inclusive rate summary sheet is attached, along with a copy of the resolution. Notice of the public hearing was provided to all customer groups, other interested parties, as well as the general public. If approved, modified rates would become effective March 1, 2025.

### **Financial Impact**

Total system revenue adjustment is estimated at 15.4% for retail customers (including inside and outside customers), 13.9% for districts, and 11.4% for Partner Cities.

### **Requested Board Action**

Staff recommends approval of Resolution 1963, which modifies water rates for all customer groups served by the Medford Water system.

# **RESOLUTION NO. 1963**

A RESOLUTION Prescribing and Establishing Rates for the Use and Sale of Water from the Municipal Water System of the City of Medford, Oregon, Within and Without Said City, to Intermittent Users, and to Special Outside Customers, Repealing All Prior Rates in Conflict Herewith and Providing That the Modifications as Set Forth in the 2024 Cost of Service Study Shall Become Effective on March 1, 2025, and Thereafter

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF WATER COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF MEDFORD, OREGON, AS FOLLOWS, THAT:

SECTION 1. On the 28th day of February 2025, all rates heretofore prescribed and established for the use and sale of water from the municipal water system of the City of Medford, Oregon, within and without said City, shall be repealed.

SECTION 2. Beginning with the billing for water service on the 1st day of March 2025, and thereafter, the rates for the use and sale of water from the municipal water system of the City of Medford, Oregon, within and without said City, shall be as set forth in the Schedules of the 2024 Cost of Service Study, a copy of which is on file at Medford Water's office and by reference made a part hereof, and summarized non-inclusively (per 1,000 gallons) as follows; the modified schedules will replace the repealed schedules in Exhibit E of the Regulations Governing Water Service, also effective March 1, 2025.

OBJECTIVE:	Board Approval

### Issue

Staff is pursuing a CM/GC construction contract for delivery of this work. The complex delivery schedule and long duration of this delivery make this approach in the best interest to the public.

### Discussion

The Distribution SCADA project is under way and timing is appropriate to engage in a construction contract to support the project. On September 26<sup>th</sup>, 2024, a Request for Proposals was publicly advertised seeking qualifications-based proposals to provide pre-construction support services from a qualified contractor. Staff reached out to 11 different contractors in the area to do as much as possible to ensure a broad pool of responders. The proposal period closed on October 24<sup>th</sup> and Medford Water was in receipt of 1 proposal from Pacific Electrical Contractors (PEC). Staff reviewed and scored the proposal. This review was performed from the aspect of determining if the qualifications provided satisfies the requirements of the RFP and would be in the public's best interest. The PEC proposal was found to exceed the requirements of the RFP. PEC's qualifications are uniquely positioned to assist Medford Water in the delivery of this project.

Considering the long duration of the project (4 to 5 years) it is critical to maintain continuity with the construction delivery. It is also essential to have maximum influence over the schedule and phasing of the construction. As the construction will be occurring in facilities which will need to remain in service for the duration of construction activities, the construction will require close coordination between the Owner, Contractor, and Consulting Engineer.

The CM/GC delivery method gives Medford Water the best position to ensure successful delivery of all the facilities over the duration of the project. The facilities will be delivered in phased packages each fiscal year. The CM/GC delivery method will allow pricing of each of these discrete packages as they are released. This will also provide an opportunity to negotiate pricing with each construction package. Recent experience with a robust CM/GC contract has provided staff with a solid and comprehensive knowledge base to manage the delivery.

### **Financial Impact**

The contract amount being requested under this Resolution will take the project thru Preconstruction services. The value of this portion of the work is \$91,000. The balance of the work will be delivered through a series of Early Work Amendment (EWA) contract amendments. Culminating with a Guaranteed Maximum Price (GMP). The overall cost to complete construction at the 44 separate facilities is estimated to be between \$2.9 and \$3.5 million delivered over 4 to 5 years. Each contracting milestone will be brought to the Board for review and authorization by Resolution.

### **Requested Board Action**

Staff recommend approval of this Resolution, authorizing the General Manager to execute a contract for Distribution SCADA Construction Distribution System SCADA & Communication System Replacement CM/GC Pre-construction services in the amount of \$91,000.

### Issue

Incorporating updated information in Sections 2 and 4 – General Employment Practices & Policies, and Employee Benefits in the Personnel Manual.

### Discussion

Personnel Manual update for Sections 2 and 4, which includes updates to Retiree Temporary Work Assignment Policy and Cash Out of Sick Leave to HRA/VEBA. A copy of the document will be made available before the meeting.

### **Financial Impact**

With this revision, there is not an additional financial impact to the Retiree Temporary Work Assignment Policy. The financial impact is related to Cash Out of Sick Leave to HRA/VEBA policy, in that at least 80 hours of sick leave must be left for employee use, as needed. If the cash out would take the employee under that amount, the cash out will not be processed for employee. This helps the employee to have leave to use for sick reasons and Paid Leave Oregon processing.
